MOTION FOR STAY OF PROCEEDINGS
PENDING APPLICATION FOR SUPERVISORY WRIT

NOW INTO COURT, through undersigned counsel, comes Defendant, YOUNGSVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT (“YPD”), pursuant to Rule 4-4 of the Uniform Rules of Courts of Appeal and Article 2201 of the Louisiana Code of Civil Procedure, and hereby respectfully moves this Honorable Court to issue a Stay Order in this matter pending the disposition of their application for supervisory writs and, in supports, states as follows:

1.

This Honorable Court executed a Judgment on May 13, 2026, overturning the Youngsville Municipal Police Civil Service Board’s decision to uphold the termination of LLOYD HENRY.

2.

By effect of this Court’s May 13, 2026 judgment, LLOYD HENRY is entitled to a reinstatement of his employment with the YPD and back pay accumulating since his date of termination.

3.

YPD respectfully avers that this decision is contrary to Louisiana law and policy, necessitating the filing of an Application for Supervisory Writ with the Court of Appeal, Third Circuit. YPD’s Notice of Intent to File Application for Supervisory Writ is being filed along with this Motion.

4.

YPD prays that a Stay Order be issued, staying the application of this Court’s May 13, 2026 Judgment until such time as their Application for Supervisory Writ is adjudicated by the Court of Appeal, Third Circuit.

5.

YPD avers that the application of the May 13, 2026 creates an extreme financial and operation burden on YPD and the City of Youngsville for which a Stay Order is necessary to prevent pending a decision by the Court of Appeal, Third Circuit on this writ application.

6.

YPD further avers that the Respondent is not prejudiced by the issuance of a Stay Order. The relief afforded by the May 13, 2026 judgment includes back pay for extended period of time for which the Respondent has not been working for the YPD. This back pay continues to accumulate, with no change in the Respondent's circumstances, while this matter is being adjudicated.

7.

There are currently no hearing or trial dates set before any court or municipal board in connection with this matter.

WHEREFORE, Defendant, YOUNGSVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT, respectfully requests that this honorable Court enter an Order staying this matter pending the disposition of their writ application and for any other relief as this Court deems just and proper
