CERTIFICATE OUTLINING FELONY PLEA AGREEMENT

I. CHARGE: The defendant JAVON PETE, agrees to plead guilty to

> Count #1 La RS 14:27 & La. R.S. 40 966(A)(1) ATTEMPT PWITD Schedule I - MDMA

- The District Attorney agrees not to charge the defendant as a habitual offender.
- The state enters a nolle prosse in all ancillary charges.

II. PLEA AGREEMENT:

In Count #1 charging La RS 40:966(A)(I) PWITD Schedule I-MDMA, the defendant, JAVON PETE, is hereby sentenced to serve FIVE (5) YEARS AT HARD LABOR with the Department of Corrections, SUSPENDED, and placed on THREE (3) YEARS OF PROBATION under the supervision of the Louisiana Department of Public Safety and Corrections under the usual and ordinary conditions of probation as provided by C.Cr.P. article 895(A) and the following special conditions:

- Report to the State of Louisiana's Dept. of Probation and Parole at 1221 Adrian St., New Iberia, LA, (337) 373-0014 within 24 hours of your plea or release from incarceration;
- 2. Report monthly or as instructed by your probation officer and pay a monthly supervision fee of \$60.00 to DOC;
- 3. Pay court costs and a fine of \$500.00;
- Pay the costs of prosecution of \$500.00 to the 16th Judicial District Attorney's Office,
- Pay \$100 00 to the Henderson Police Department to defray the cost of investigation, 5.
- 6. Pay \$100.00 to the 16th Judicial Acadiana Crime Lab Fund,
- All financial obligations, unless otherwise noted herein, shall be paid in twenty-four (24) equal monthly installments beginning within thirty (30) days from the date probation begins;
- 8. Perform ten (10) eight (8) hour days of community service within ONE (1) year from the date of your plea,
- Submit to and pay for SIX (6) random drug screens within the first 18 months of your probation and during the remaining term of probation at the direction of your probation officer;
- 10. Remain continually and gainfully employed or a full time student during the term of your probation;
- 11. Remain drug & alcohol free; stay out of bars, casinos, lounges and away from illicit drug and substance abusers;
- 12. Comply with all provisions, if applicable, of La R.S 15:601, et seq., relating to DNA detection of sexual and violent offenders:
- 13. Defendant acknowledges and agrees that as a condition of probation and/or parole he is subject to have his home, persons, vehicles and effects searched by officers of the Department of Probation and Parole, on a random basis, to determine compliance with the law and the terms of this sentence.
- 14 Defendant acknowledges notice of intent of the 16th Judicial District Attorney's Office to seek a civil money judgment in accordance with LSA Code of Criminal Procedure Article 886 1 in the event of nonpayment of the fine, court costs and costs of prosecution within sixty (60) days of the imposition of sentence herein.





Art. 556.1 Compliance-Possible Consequences to a Plea of Guilty or No Contest

I, <u>Jayon</u> Pete, have been advised if I plead guilty or no contest, I may lose entitlement to certain Federal and State Rights temporarily or permanently. Those rights include but are not limited to:

- 1. The **right to remain in the United States** if I am not a natural born or naturalized citizen of the United States. I can be and may be deported to my country of origin or other places designated by the Federal Government, even though my charges are State charges.
- 2. I may lose my right to vote in Local, State, and Federal elections temporarily or permanently.
- 3. I may lose my Federal and State **rights to own, possess and to bear firearms** of any type, including but not limited to legal hunting, sports, and employment, including as law enforcement and service in the United States Military Armed Forces.
- 4. I may lose my Federal and State rights to due process under the law which is not limited to but may include the right to privacy and to be free from warrantless searches. For example, I may be searched and/or seized by a Probation/Parole Officer without warrant while I am on Probation or Parole. I may also be detained.
- 5. I may lose my Federal and State rights to equal protection under the law which is not limited to but may include the right to work, live and be at places of my choosing without interference from governmental entities. For example, if I am convicted of a sex offense, domestic violence offense, or are under a protective order of the court, I may be subject to restrictions on housing, employment, or presence near victims or persons protected by the Orders of the Court regardless of age and relationship. I may be restricted or prohibited from social media.
- 6. I may lose my Federal and State rights to college admission and/or access to Financial Aid and Assistance Programs.
- 7. I may lose my Federal and State rights to Housing Assistance Programs.
- 8. I may lose my Federal and State rights to employment including but not limited to practice professions for which license is required to be issued.
- 9. I may lose my Federal and State rights to public benefits including but not limited to Unemployment Insurance Benefit Payments, Social Security, SSI, Medicaid, Medicare, Food Stamps, WIC, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT), Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT), and other governmental assistance programs.
- 10. If I have one or more convictions of crimes, and this plea results in a second or subsequent conviction, the State can charge me as a **Habitual Offender**. If I am convicted of being a Habitual Offender, my exposure to jail time may increase without parole eligibility.
- 11. I understand that if a Protective Order or other Court Order is in place and in effect, that contact by any means with the protected person or persons is a separate violation of the criminal law and may be contempt of court in addition to grounds for revocation of bond, Probation or Parole, and that my right and ability to own, possess, use, carry or otherwise be in the vicinity of a firearm may be impeded temporarily under both State and Federal law or for the period of Probation, Parole or the term of the Protective Order or permanently.
- 12. I understand that if I am on **Probation or Parole** the standard for revocation is not beyond a reasonable doubt (as at a trial), but it is a mere preponderance of the evidence. All the constitutional rights afforded the defendant in a criminal trial are not provided to the probationer and hearsay is admissible.

I UNDERSTAND THAT ALL EXAMPLES LISTED ABOVE ARE MERE ILLUSTRATIONS AND NOT EXCLUSIVE. OTHER CONSEQUENCES MAY OCCUR.
